WINTER APPLE CRUMBLE

- Apple Crumble Topping
 all purpose flour
 - brown sugar
 - baking powder
 - salt
 - ground cinnamon
 - unsalted butter
- Apple Crumble Filling
 - apples
 - sugar
 - lemon juice
 - corn starch or all purpose flour
 - salt
 - ground ci<mark>nnam</mark>on

Apple Crumble Topping

- 1.Combine dry ingredients in a medium bowl and whisk to combine.
- 2.Stir in the melted butter with a fork until crumbly.

Apple Crumble Filling

- 1. Combine apples, granulated sugar, lemon juice, cornstarch (or flour if using) and cinnamon.
- 2.Transfer to a baking dish and spread into an even layer.
- **3**.Sprinkle crumble mixture evenly over the top of the filling.
- 4. Bake at 350 for 35 to 45 minutes or until bubbling and golden brown on top.
- **5**.Let cool for 15 minutes to allow the filling to thicken.

LUGGE (LOOG-UH)

LUgge draws inspiration from the Danish and Norwegian concept of *Hygge* (pronounced "hoo-ga"), a word that embodies warmth, comfort, and contentment. It's about embracing life's simple joys, cherished moments with loved ones, relaxing in cozy surroundings, and indulging in the small pleasures of good food and drink.



Winter Carnival: A Lawrence tradition since the 1930s, Winter Carnival invites students to celebrate the season from late January to early February.
